


2. Classification of Reports

Graph 2.1: Classification of STRs received by Agency Business Type (Sectors)




The chart above shows that the total number of STRs received during the period under review slightly decreased to 125 STRs when compared to 127 STRs recorded in Aug 2022. Further, from all the STRs received in the period under review, only 14 reports were classified as 'high priority' while 32 were still under cleansing at the time of reporting. The banking sector continues to file the most STRs nationally.

Graph 2.2: STRs by Reporting Entities




In the period under review, Bank-B filed the majority of STRs (79 STRs).

To date, the total number of SARs and STRs classified as 'low priority' amounts to 896 and 7,050 reports, respectively.


4. Disclosures




