


2. Classification of Reports

During December, Bank-C filed the majority of STRs (67 STRs). The banks and ADLAs collectively submitted 106 STRs. Records indicate that only 10 STRs were escalated to cases, whereas 104 STRs were placed on low priority.


Graph 2.3: Classification of SARs received by the Banking and ADLA Sectors



A total of 17 SARs were filed by the sectors. Records indicate that all reports were placed on low priority.


3. Disclosures
